Quick Overview

Dark purple color. Concentrate explosive dark fruit nose. Exceptional soft and delicate attack. Great evolution on the mid-palate and the finish with some plum and a touch of orange peel.



The History

In common with its neighbour, Château Haut Corbin, Château Le Jurat belongs to the S.M.A.B.T.P. (insurers) and is run by the same technical team. Its single-plot 7.5-hectare (18.5 acres) vineyard boasts a multitude of soil types a unique distinction that gives its wines great personality and expression with black cherry aromas occasionally accompanied by smoky and spicy notes.



WineMaking

Manual harvest and sorting. Vinification in small thermoregulated cement vats. Ageing in oak barrels during 12 months, with 25 to 30% new oak barrels each year



Production

Production: 45 000 bottles . Soil: Sandy clayey
