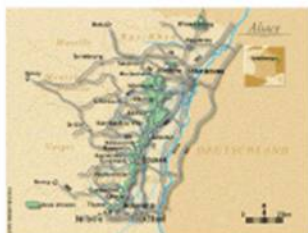


Rene Barth Tokay Pinot Gris

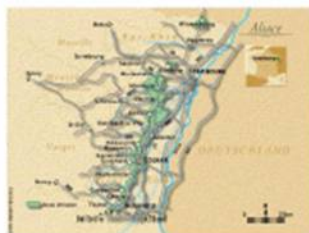

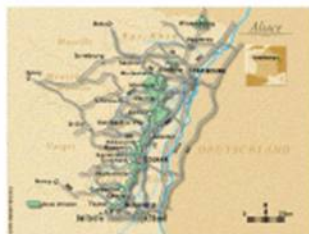
